Explanatory Memorandum

1.0 Object and reasons:

- 1.1 The Bill seeks to amend the Police Powers Act 2007 ("principal Act").
- 1.2 The object of the Bill is to provide a delegation power for the Commissioner of Police to delegate the Services' functions with regards to the registration and licensing of vehicles and licensing of drivers to any capable entity.

Clauses:

<u>Clause 1</u>: - provides for the short title and commencement.

<u>Clause 2</u>: - inserts a new section 36BA to the principal Act to:

- (a) provide for the Commissioner's delegation powers; and
- (b) such delegation power may be revoked, renewed or varied at any time by the Commissioner.

<u>Clause 3:</u> - provides for transitional matters.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Police Powers Act 2007 (Principal Act).

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislative Assembly of Samoa in Parliament assembled as follows:

1. Short title and commencement:

- (1) This Act may be cited as the Police Powers Amendment Act 2019.
- (2) This Act commences on the date of assent by the Head of State.

2. New section 36BA inserted:

After section 36B of the Principal Act insert:

"36BA. Delegation of Powers:

- (1) The Commissioner may in writing, delegate the Services' function under section 36A, to any capable entity.
- (2) A delegation under sub-section (1) may be revoked, renewed or varied at any time by the Commissioner.".

3. Transitional:

An act done or omission made after 1 July 2019 and before the commencement of this Act by an entity other than the Service as the Principal Licensing Authority, is regarded as valid as if carried out under a delegation made pursuant to section 36BA.
