REGULATIONS**PART I**

1. Short title and commencement-(1) These Regulations may be cited as the International Passenger Charge Regulations 2010.

(2) These Regulations commence on the date they are made by the Head of State.

2. Interpretation - In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:

“Act” means the Civil Aviation Act 1998;

“Airport Authority” means the Airport Authority established under the Airport Authority Act 1984;

“Manager” means the Civil Aviation Manager appointed under the Airport Authority Act 1984;

“Passenger” means a person departing from Samoa on an aircraft;

“Transit Passenger” means a person who has arrived in Samoa on an aircraft and who is in the course of travelling to another destination.

PART II

3. International Passenger Charge - Subject to regulation 5, all passengers departing from an aerodrome operated or managed by the Airport Authority, must pay an international passenger charge of \$40.00.

4. Payment - Payment of the international passenger charge shall be made at such place and in the manner approved by the Manager.

5. Waiver of Charge - Payment of the international passenger charge is waived for:

(a) the Head of State;

(b) children under the age of 12 years;

(c) Transit passengers who are in Samoa for less than twenty-four (24) hours;

- (d) any other passengers exempt from payment of the international passenger charge under any other Act;
- (e) such other passenger or class of passenger as the Minister may specify in writing.

6. Repeal - The Civil Aviation International Passenger Charge Regulations 1999 is repealed.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Ordinance 1953.
Date of Commencement: These Regulations commence on the date they are made by the Head of State.
These Regulations are administered by the Ministry of Works, Transport and Infrastructure.
